

Level 5 Interval Practice

Sing an **ascending** MINOR THIRD by singing "la-ti-DO" from the first note (**O-CANADA**).

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



13 Sing a **descending** MINOR THIRD by singing "do-ti-LA" or ("**Fros-ty**" the snowman) from the first note.

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



25 Sing an **ascending** MAJOR THIRD by singing "do-re-MI" or ("**do a DEER**" or "row-row-row-your-BOAT") from the first note.

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



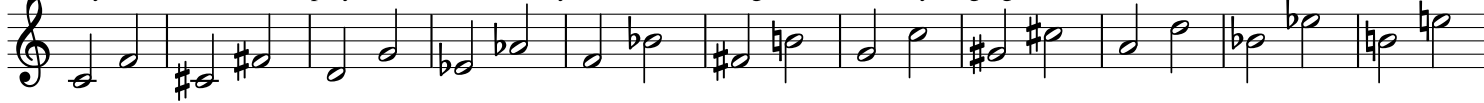
37 Sing a **descending** MAJOR THIRD by singing "mi-re-DO" ("**MARY-HAD**" a little lamb) from the first note.)

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



49 Sing an **ascending** PERFECT FOURTH by singing "do-re-mi-FA" or (frosty the "**SNOW-MAN**") from the first note.

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



60 Sing a **descending** PERFECT FOURTH by singing "fa-mi-re-DO" or ("**O-COME-ALL**" ye faithful) from the first note

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



71 Sing an **ascending** PERFECT FIFTH by singing "do-re-mi-fa-SO" or "do-SO!" (**star wars main theme/twinkle twinkle**) from the first note.

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



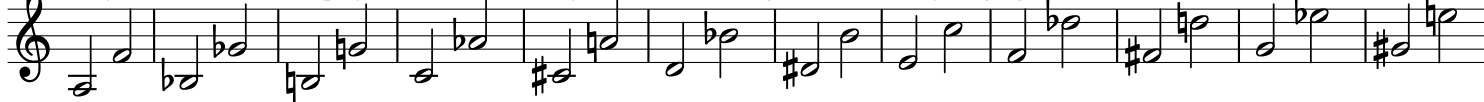
83 Sing a **descending** PERFECT FIFTH by singing "so-fa-mi-re-DO" or "so-DO" (**minuet in G by Bach or Swan Lake**)

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



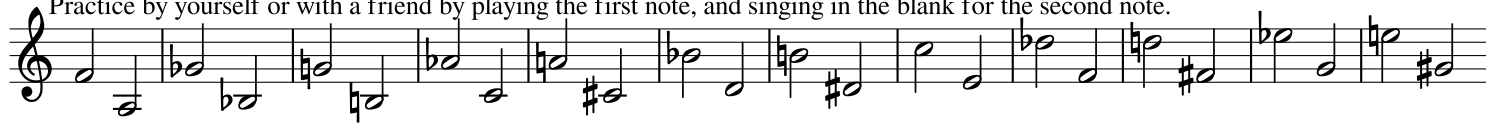
95 Sing an **ascending** MINOR SIXTH by singing "do-re-mi-fa-so-LA" (**thinking of a harmonic minor scale**) or **the entertainer**

Test yourself or a friend: play the first note of any bar, and then sing in-the-blank by singing the second note.



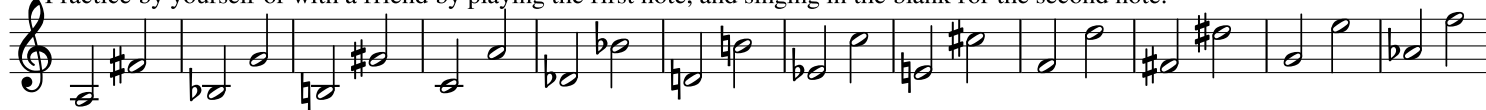
Sing a **descending MINOR SIXTH**. **Tips:** Try singing "do-re-mi (silently) for a major third going up, then transpose "DO" 1 octave down. or listen to the "love story" first two notes of main theme on piano (ask your teacher to play it if you dont know it) and sing "Mi-SO"

107 Practice by yourself or with a friend by playing the first note, and singing in the blank for the second note.



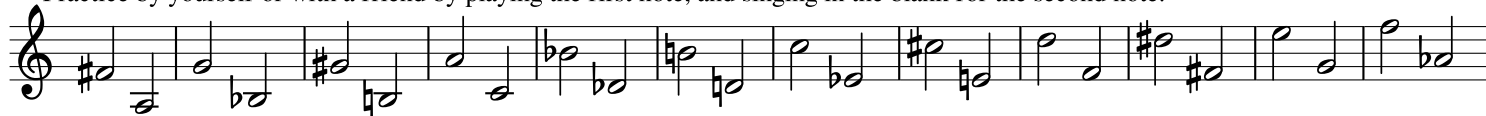
Sing an **ascending MAJOR SIXTH** by singing do-re-me-fa-so-LA (thinking of a **major scale**) or sing "**DASHING** through the snow"

119 Practice by yourself or with a friend by playing the first note, and singing in the blank for the second note.



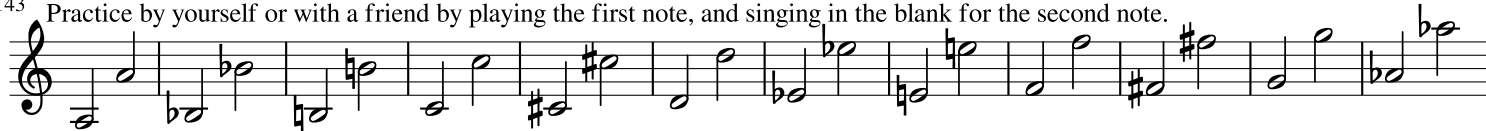
Sing a **descending MAJOR SIXTH** by singing "la-DO" (thinking of first two notes in "**Music of the night**" from *Phantom of the Opera*)

131 Practice by yourself or with a friend by playing the first note, and singing in the blank for the second note.



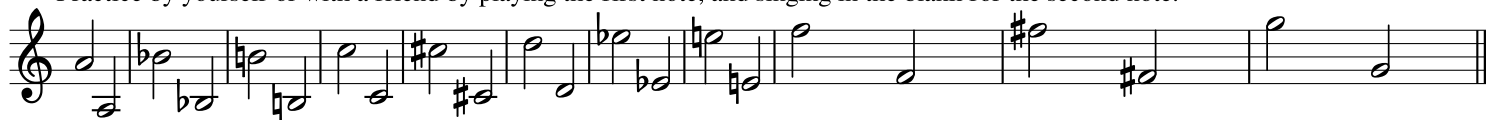
Sing an **ascending PERFECT OCTAVE** by singing "do-DO" (you can think of the top and bottom notes of a scale, or the third happy birthday in "Happy birthday to you, happy birthday to you. **HAPPY BIRTHday** to (someone)" or sing "**SOMEWHERE** over the rainbow".

143 Practice by yourself or with a friend by playing the first note, and singing in the blank for the second note.



Sing a **descending PERFECT OCTAVE** by singing "do-DO".

155 Practice by yourself or with a friend by playing the first note, and singing in the blank for the second note.



Practice tips: For all the intervals, singing the **correct pitch** is important. Sing **LOUD** and **LONG** on the second pitch. (For the exam, you can sing on anything (even "LA LA"), so don't get caught up memorizing the solfege (la-ti-do, or mi-so etc) for each interval.) The examiner will ask you to sing an interval up or down from a note, and will play the first note for you once.

Practice singing them everyday you can and enjoy singing away in your practice! => =>
